Spring has sprung!



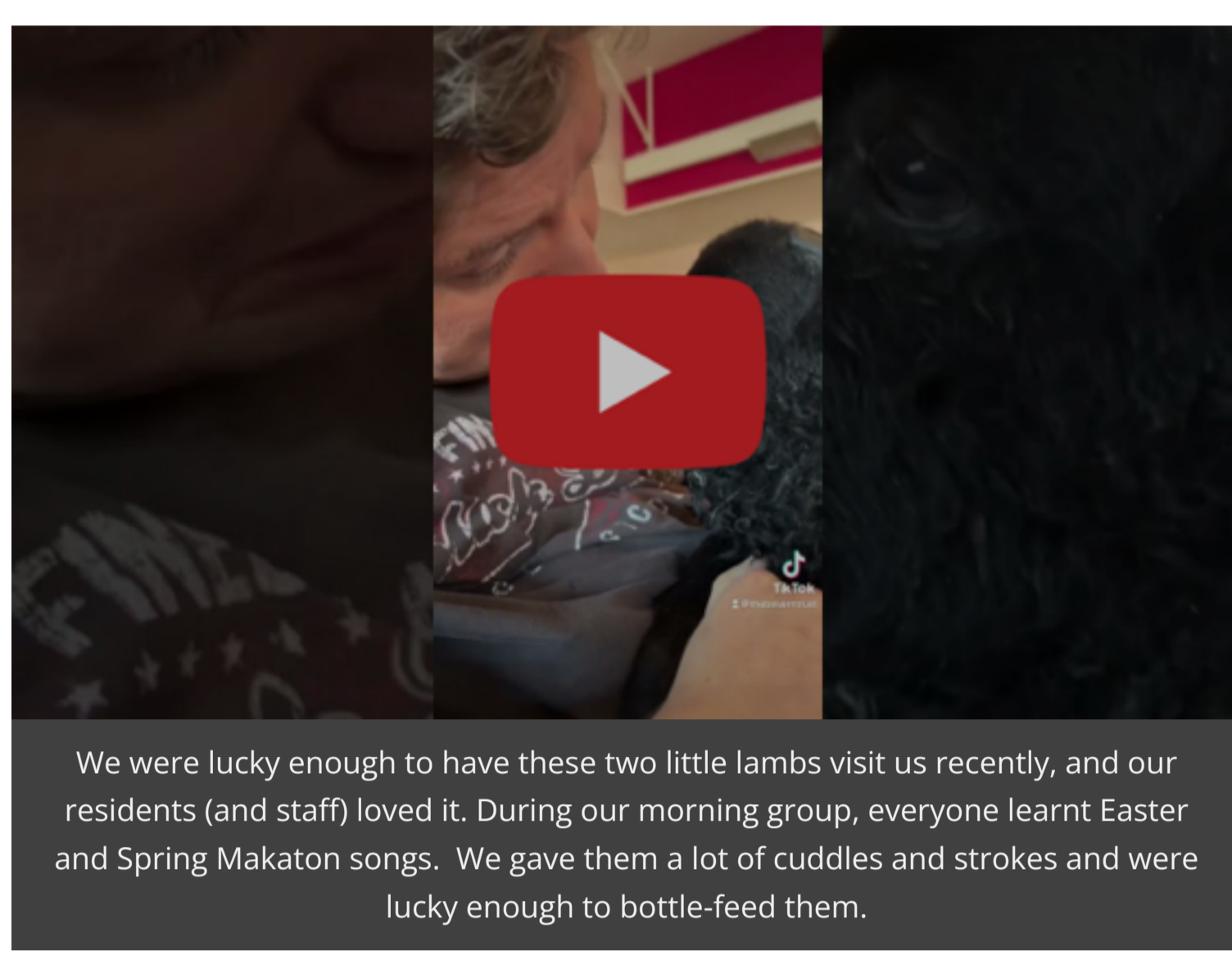

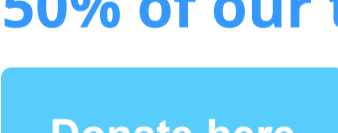
Minibus Appeal Update
