An adaptive switch enables them to use technology and operate electronic devices. Instead of turning a knob or coordinating two actions at once, the switches offer easier movement solutions, such as pressing a button. Chloe loves using the switch to turn the mixer on and off when baking and Ciaron loved using a switch to make his friends laugh with funny sounds and visuals during an interactive game.
















Happy Birthday Holly!
